

Dr. Jocelyn R. Smith Lee

Dr. Jocelyn R. Smith Lee is an Assistant Professor of Human Development and Family Studies (HDFS) at the University of North Carolina, Greensboro (UNCG). Dr. Jocelyn R. Smith Lee is the recipient of the <u>2023 Community Engaged Scholar Award</u> for her narrative change campagin, <u>In All Ways Human</u>, from the School of Health and Human Sciences at UNCG. Rooted in Baltimore and growing in Greensboro, her research examines the health disparities of violent injury and violent death and works to <u>understand how losing loved ones to homicide shapes the health, well-being, development, and family relationships of Black males and their social networks.</u>

At UNCG, Dr. Smith Lee is the founder and director of the <u>Centering Black Voices</u> research lab (Twitter: <u>@CenterBLKVoices</u>) whose mission is to affirm humanity, prevent violence, and promote healing in the lives of Black boys, men, and families through research and action. She is also a recipient of the <u>2020 Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Grand Challenge Competition</u>: Voices for Economic Opportunity for her project, "Disrupting Dehumanizing Narratives of Black Men in Poverty".
